Faith Guiding Certificate

Developing respect and mutual understanding between people of all faiths and communities, through training Faith Guides for places of worship

The Faith Encounter Programme has pioneered a new specialist training programme for 'Faith Guides' since October 2007. The Certificate has been accredited by the Institute of Tourist Guiding at Level 2. The second course will commence in January 2009, in Queensbridge School.

The programme focuses on a fixed site guiding qualification, with a special emphasis on the interpretation and presentation of the relevant faith.

In addition, Faith Guides have the opportunity to deepen their knowledge of their own Faith.

Programme Content

The programme includes:

- Knowledge of a specific faith and place of worship
- Interpretation and presentation skills
- Customer care and risk assessment
- Sensitivity to visitors of all faith backgrounds
- Guiding school groups
- Preparation of resource materials
- Planning of a site specific guided tour

How the programme will be delivered

The course will take place on Wednesday evenings from 6.00 pm – 9.00pm, plus 2 additional workshop sessions. It will be offered on a part time basis over a period of 12 weeks and will include guiding practice and training visits to places of worship. *It will commence at 6.00 pm on Wednesday January 7th 2009.* It will be completed in April 2009. The assessment is through both written and practical examinations.

Number of places available

There will be places for 20 trainee Faith Guides on the course.

Who can apply?

Applications are invited from practising members of any recognised Faith community. There are no specific entry qualifications for the course, apart from the ability to communicate well in English.

Application forms are available from the Faith Encounter Programme. *Please note,* in addition to completing the form, applicants need to include a reference from a recognised Faith leader in their own community.

Programme Fees

The fee for the course is £100 per trainee but concessions are available based on evidence of income.

Why?
